PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Short Range Transportation Planning

The St. Lucie Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) has released its draft FY 2007/2008 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The UPWP identifies transportation planning activities to be undertaken in the metropolitan planning area in fiscal year 2007/2008. The objective of the work program is to ensure that the St. Lucie MPO's continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive (3-C) approach to planning for transportation needs is maintained and coordinated with other parties. The document is required for the MPO to receive Federal Highway Administration, Federal Transit Administration, Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged and the Florida Department of Transportation funds.

The specific transportation planning programs to be undertaken by the MPO during fiscal year 2007/2008 are organized into four major categories:

- Program Administration – includes those functions necessary to administer and manage the transportation planning program on a continuous basis, including program administration, review, and reporting.
- Data Collection and Surveillance Activities – consists of those work tasks that are required to support other planning activities. These include a continuous monitoring of travel characteristics and factors, such as land use data and transportation system data, affecting travel in the urbanized area.
- Systems Planning – involves transportation systems planning work tasks, such as long and short-term highway and transit planning, which are supportive of the overall transportation planning effort.

- Project Planning – consists of projects that may be either one-time or continuing tasks that are of special interest within the study area. These include such tasks as corridor studies and special projects. Projects include:
 - Transportation Disadvantaged Program
 - Bicycle/Pedestrian Greenway Planning Program
 - Regional & Intergovernmental Coordination
 - Becker Road Corridor Study
 - North/Mid County Collector Study
 - Community Profile Study

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Reauthorization of Programmatic General Permits SAJ-77 and SAJ-78 Authorizing Fill Activities

The US Army Corps of Engineers (COE) is proposing the reauthorization of two Programmatic General Permits that will authorize fill activities for single-family residences within Jupiter Farms (Permit SAJ-77) and Palm Beach Country Estates (Permit SAJ-78) in Palm Beach County. The permits include Special Conditions that will limit the amount of fill, protect adjacent waterbodies and wetlands, and provide mitigation for wetland impacts through the purchase, restoration, and long-term management at an offsite mitigation area referred to as the South Loxahatchee Slough Restoration Project. The established mitigation fee for this area (based on an agreement between the COE, Florida Department of Environmental Protection, and Palm Beach County) is one acre of mitigation for each acre of impact. The required mitigation fee will be made payable to the Palm Beach County Environmental Resources Management Pollution Recovery Trust Fund-Jupiter Farms/Palm Beach Country Estates. These permits ensure that mitigation will be provided for wetland impacts on small lots that were previously exempt from wetland permitting criteria.

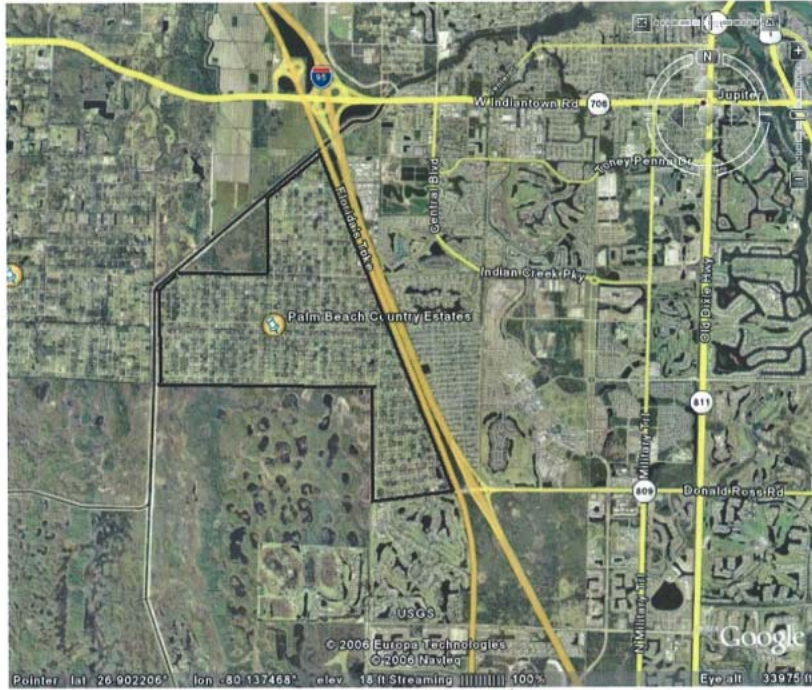
