PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Air Pollution Control Program Support

The Palm Beach County Health Department operates a local air pollution control program that is approved by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. The major responsibilities of the program include ambient air monitoring, compliance assurance & enforcement, stationary source permitting, mobile source control, community complaint investigation, air quality planning, and public outreach. The Health Department's air program receives federal assistance in the form of a Section 105 grant from the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency. The grant supports activities related to the implementation of the Clean Air Act and federal initiatives. In addition to the major responsibilities, this grant supports special programs including asbestos, pollution prevention, compliance assistance, indoor air environments, emission inventories, and air toxics.

APPLICANT: Indian River County

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Indian River County – Disaster Recovery Program Application, Hurricane Wilma Supplemental Funding, FY 2007

During the hurricane season of 2005, areas within Indian River County sustained some damage from Hurricane Wilma. The County's affordable housing stock, which is mostly conventionally built homes, was especially hard hit. Through the disaster recovery program, the County will provide funding to rehabilitate or provide mitigation, through building hardening, for six (6) housing units. The rehabilitation and mitigation activities are estimated to provide a benefit to ten (10) low and moderate income residents, of which three (3) will be classified as very low income.

The program will involve the rehabilitation of storm damaged homes as well as mitigation of other housing units which are owned and occupied by low and moderate income families and currently do not meet the County's building code requirements. The County will advertise and give all qualified property owners living within the County the opportunity to submit an application to have their homes addressed under the Disaster Recovery Program.

Through such activities, the Disaster Recovery Program is meeting the national objective of providing a benefit to low and moderate income persons.
